1. Purpose of This Report

2. What Both Parents Agree About

Strong Alignment - both parents indicated that:

- Both parents mentioned "ethan" when describing child's primary need.
- Both parents mentioned "both home, work, school" when describing what is working.
- Both parents mentioned "shared, updates, weekly" when describing desired improvements.
- Both parents mentioned "brief, email, weekly" when describing options you would consider.

3. Where the Parents See Things Differently

Concerns

6. Areas for Conversation
