1. Purpose of This Report

This report is prepared through a third-party mediator rather than directly between the parents. It compares the independently provided perspectives of both parents to identify areas of shared understanding, differences in perspective, and subjects that may benefit from professional assistance. Individual responses are not shared between the parties. The names and answers in this sample are fictional.

2. What Both Parents Agree About

Strong Alignment - both parents indicated that:

- Both parents mentioned "exchanges" when describing child's primary need.
- Both parents mentioned "documented" when describing what is working.
- Both parents mentioned "continued, exchange" when describing desired improvements.
- Both parents mentioned "professional, review, supervised" when describing options you would consider.
- Both parents mentioned "likely, other" when describing the other parent's likely concerns.

3. Where the Parents See Things Differently

Concerns

Parent A's Perspective

Unplanned contact outside the agreed protocol creates uncertainty about safety arrangements.

Parent B's Perspective

I would like the exchange schedule confirmed further in advance to reduce last-minute stress.

Both parents agree that this subject matters for the child. The difference concerns how the shared goal should be accomplished, rather than the underlying goal itself.

4. Child's Identified Needs

- Physical and emotional safety first
- Structures that limit unsafe contact
- Clear emergency protocols
- Professional guidance experienced with family violence
- Detailed, unambiguous arrangements

6. Areas for Conversation

- What arrangements keep the child and the safe parent protected?
- Are current orders or protections clear to both parents?
- What communication is safe and necessary?
- What warning signs require immediate action?
- Who should be involved professionally?

7. Options and Resources

Neutral options - SA CoParents does not decide; it builds options.

- Option A: Neutral or supervised exchange locations.
- Option B: Communication through an app or professionals only.
- Option C: Detailed parenting orders with emergency protocols.

8. Potential Areas of Alignment

Both parents appear aligned around the goal of supporting the child regarding safety / family violence. Although they currently describe different perspectives in some areas, both parents agree that the child's needs come first and that working toward a shared understanding is worthwhile.

9. Questions for the Parents

- Is any direct communication currently safe?
- What professional guidance is in place?
- Are emergency contacts and protocols documented?
- What structure reduces risk while meeting the child's needs?

10. Possible Next Steps

- Continue Parent Discussion
- Discuss With Mediator

- Consult Teacher / School Counselor
- Consult Child's Professional
- Develop Written Parenting Protocol
- Create Another Joint Report
